ABOUT THE AUTHORS

GEORGE GERSHWIN, 1898-1937 (*Music & Lyrics*) was an American composer and pianist. Gershwin's compositions spanned both popular and classical genres, and his most popular melodies are widely known. He wrote most of his vocal and theatrical works, including more than a dozen Broadway shows, in collaboration with his elder brother, lyricist Ira Gershwin. George Gershwin composed music for both Broadway and the classical concert hall, as well as popular songs that brought his work to an even wider public. His compositions have been used in numerous films and on television, and many have become jazz standards recorded in numerous variations.

IRA GERSHWIN. 1896-1983 (Music & Lyrics) was an American lyricist who collaborated with his younger brother, composer George Gershwin, to create some of the most memorable songs of the 20th century. With George he wrote more than a dozen Broadway shows, featuring such songs as "I Got Rhythm," "Embraceable You," "The Man I Love," and "Someone to Watch Over Me," and the opera Porgy and Bess. The success the brothers had with their collaborative works has often overshadowed the creative role that Ira played. However, his mastery of songwriting continued after the early death of George. He wrote additional hit songs with composers Jerome Kern, Kurt Weill, and Harold Arlen. His critically acclaimed 1959 book Lyrics on Several Occasions, an amalgam of autobiography and annotated anthology, is an important source for studying the art of the lyricist in the golden age of American popular song.

PETER STONE, 1930-2003 (Book) wrote the books for Titanic, 1776, The Will Rogers Follies, and Woman of the Year; which all won the Tony Award for Best Musical, His other musicals are Mv One and Only, Sugar, Two By Two, and Kean, He won an Academy Award for his screenplay Father Goose, the Edgar (Mystery Writers of America) Award) for his film Charade, and the Christopher Award for the screen adaptation of 1776. Other films: The Taking of Pelham 1-2-3. Sweet Charity. Who's Killing the Great Chefs of Europe?, and Just Cause. Writing for TV, he won the Emmy Award (the only writer ever to win the Tony, Oscar, and Emmy) for an episode of "The Defenders." He served as president of the Dramatist Guild from 1981 to 1998.

TIMOTHY S. MAYER (Book) won the Phyllis Anderson Award at Harvard where he founded the Agassiz Theatre Company with Thomas Babe and to which he returned in 1981 as Artist-in-Residence. He was Levine Senior Fellow at Yale and a Rockefeller Fellow in Public Television for which he wrote and directed "Jesus: A Passion Play" and appeared in a one-man talk show. In 1985, he was associate director of the American National Theater and directed its first production, Part I of Shakespeare's Henry IV, at the Kennedy Center in Washington. Mayer wrote the lyrics for "Home by Another Way" on James Taylor's album Never Die Young.

PROGRAM NOTES

"Come on along, you can't go wrong Kicking the clouds away!"

Broadway was booming in the 1920s with the energy of youth and new ideas roaring across the nation. In New York City, immigrants such as George Gershwin were infusing American music with their own indigenous traditions. The melting pot was cooking up a completely new sound and jazz was a key ingredient. At the time, radio and the phonograph weren't widely available; sheet music and live performances remained the popular ways to enjoy the latest hits. In fact, New York City's Tin Pan Alley was overflowing with "song pluggers" like George Gershwin who demonstrated new tunes to promote the sale of sheet music.

George and his brother Ira Gershwin composed music and lyrics for the 1927 Broadway musical Funny Face. It was the second musical they had written as a vehicle for Fred and Adele Astaire. As such, Funny Face enabled the tapdancing duo to feature new and well-loved routines. During a number entitled "High Hat," Fred sported evening clothes and a top hat while tapping in front of an enormous male chorus. The image of Fred during that song became iconic and versions of the routine appeared in later years. The unforgettable score featured such gems as "'S Wonderful," "My One And Only," "He Loves and She Loves," and "The Babbitt and the Bromide." The plot concerned a girl named Frankie (Adele Astaire), who persuaded her boyfriend Peter (Allen Kearns) to help retrieve her stolen diary from Jimmie Reeve (Fred Astaire). However, Peter pilfered a piece of jewelry and a wild chase ensued. Funny Face was the first production at the newly built Alvin Theatre (now the Neil Simon Theatre) and it ran for 244 performances.

During the 1927-1928 season there were 264 shows on Broadway, making it the peak of the most production-filled decade in history. The desire to revisit such a vibrant time on Broadway was enticing and in 1981, a revival of *Funny Face* was in discussion. After opening on Broadway as *My One And Only*, the show would retain seven songs from *Funny Face* and the program stated that, "It is, in all other respects, a wholly new invention." Those songs included the excised

number "How Long Has This Been Going On?" as well as "My One And Only," "High Hat," "He Loves and She Loves," "In the Swim," "Funny Face," and "'S Wonderful." To complete the score, additional songs were pulled from other Gershwin shows and movies, such as "Strike Up the Band" from the show of the same name and "Nice Work If You Can Get It" from the movie *A Damsel in Distress*.

On May 1, 1983 My One And Only opened on Broadway; a stylish art deco entertainment, it featured glamorous hoofing flappers, a debonair fly boy, a winsome English Channel swimmer, and classic Gershwin music. Despite its success at the St. James Theatre and the glorious appeal of the elements mentioned above, the show followed a classically difficult route.

During an interview two years earlier, writer and producer, Bernard Carragher learned that Tommy Tune desired to be back on stage. Tune had not had a role on Broadway since 1974, when he won a Tony for his part in *Seesaw*. Carragher later spoke with Peter Sellars, a young director at the American Repertory Theatre who wanted to make a musical. Carragher informed Sellars that Tune was eager to be in one. Tune and Sellars agreed to work together and Tune persuaded Sellars to hire the English model Twiggy as his co-star. Craig Smith would be Music Director, and he was charged with a difficult task: the original *Funny Face* orchestrations didn't exist. Meanwhile, Sellars' friend, Timothy

S. Mayer penned a script inspired by his "obsessive, irresistible image of Tommy and Twiggy tap-dancing together."

Before the show opened out-of-town, there was clear dissension between Sellars and Tune. Sellars' vision for the production resembled Brechtian satire, while Tune intended something lighter and more accessible. The producers brought Peter Stone and Mike Nichols in as "show doctors" and Stone later reported the following: "Nothing was working. The concept, above all, was not working. It was very hard to describe because it was a neo-Brechtian, socioeconomic pageant using the trappings of an old Gershwin show." Daniel Sherkow of Paramount Theatre Productions ultimately fired Sellars a few days before the show was to open in Boston and Craig Smith met a similar fate. After the opening at the Colonial Theatre. the show's co-choreographers. Thommie Walsh and Tommy Tune, were credited with staging and choreography, while Jack Lee took over as Music & Vocal Director.

The producers considered closing the show and everything seemed to be falling apart. However, Peter Stone and Mike Nichols were in love with aspects of the production and asked the producers for ten days to rewrite the book. Their efforts proved successful and the producers planned to open in New York two weeks later. Many in the Broadway community wanted to see the show succeed. Even Michael Bennett volunteered to help adjust the dance numbers. After the Broadway opening, Variety described My One And Only as "one of the most successful salvage efforts in recent Broadway history." The show went on to tour internationally, receive nine Tony awards, and leave audiences floating on air.

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
HISTORY OF THE GOODSPEED OPERA HOUSE

The Goodspeed Opera House has endured as a majestic presence on the Connecticut River since it was built in 1876 by William H. Goodspeed, a shipping and banking magnate and avid theatre lover. Since that time the Opera House has lived two lives: the first as a bustling center of commerce, housing a theatre, professional offices, steamboat passenger terminal and a general store; and the second, after a period of neglect and deterioration, as a magnificent professional musical theatre fully restored in 1963 to its original splendor.

Goodspeed's history goes back to its opening night on October 24, 1877, when a repertory group presented the comedy Charles II and the farces Box and Cox and Turn Him Out. Featured performers of the day were brought to East Haddam by steamboat, many directly from theatre in New York.

After William Goodspeed's death, the theatre was eventually sold and used as a storage depot for the State Highway Department. The building was marked for demolition in 1958, but local preservationists became interested and in 1959 The Goodspeed Opera House Foundation was organized to restore and reactivate the theatre. With the cooperation of the State of Connecticut and the support of donor-members, the Goodspeed Opera

House was restored and rededicated on June 18, 1963, with the opening of the musical Oh Lady! Lady!!

ABOUT GOODSPEED MUSICALS



Goodspeed Musicals was first formed as The Goodspeed Opera House Foundation in 1959 to restore the 19th century Goodspeed Opera House as a professional theatre. Under the direction of Michael P. Price since 1968, Goodspeed has achieved acclaim as the home of musical theatre. Mixing classics by the Gershwins, Cole Porter, and Jerome Kern with the very best of this country's newest musicals, such as *Annie*, *Man of La Mancha*, and *Shenandoah*, Goodspeed pioneered the practice of rethinking, restoring, and revitalizing America's musical theatre heritage.

Goodspeed Opera House

Dedicated to the preservation and advancement of musical theatre, Goodspeed produces three musicals April through December on its mainstage in East Haddam. Nineteen Goodspeed productions have gone on to Broadway, receiving more than a dozen Tony Awards. Goodspeed itself has been awarded two Special Tony Awards, one in 1980 for outstanding contributions to the American musical and a second in 1995 for distinguished achievement for a regional theatre.

Located in rural East Haddam on the Connecticut River, the historic Victorian-style Opera House takes musicals from the past and brings them to life for today's audiences.

New Musicals at The Norma Terris Theatre

The Max Showalter Center for Education in Musical Theatre

In 2002, Goodspeed Musicals established The Max Showalter Center for Education in Musical Theatre. The Center encourages and nurtures musical theatre artists and students by providing a unique and comprehensive array of training and educational programs to serve both the national and local academic communities. As a part of that mission, the Center conducts the annual Goodspeed Musical Theatre Institute in collaboration with New York University's Tisch School of the Arts. The Hartt School at the University of Hartford, and Boston Conservatory. In addition, it offers education pages on Goodspeed's website, allowing visitors to further participate in and appreciate the rich and vibrant world of musical theatre. Special Services:

Handicapped parking is located in front of the Gelston House and in the spaces closest to the footbridge along the stream in the Main Parking Lot. Access to the Opera House for patrons who are unable to manage stairs is via an elevator with an outside entrance located on the side of the building closest to the swing bridge. Elevator service is available to the lobby and the orchestra level of the Opera House; the mezzanine level is not accessible via elevator.

Please contact our House Manager in advance if you require special assistance of any kind, such as:


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


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


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
